Local history study: I understand the basic history of our local area – I know what The Abbey was used for in the past and how it is still an important part of our community today. I can retell the story of St Edmund. (Local Visit to the Abbey Ruins and Cathedral)

 I can describe events in the past and use the terms BC and AD. I can use a timeline. I can explain what everyday life was like in Ancient Egypt. I can explain why the Egyptians buried their pharaohs with their belongings. I understand how historic artefacts found in Tutankhamun's tomb can be used to help build up a picture of life in Ancient Egypt. I can explain how the lives of wealthy people were different from the lives of poorer people in Ancient Egypt. Migration: I can explain why people came to Britain and settled near rivers. I can explain that in the Old Stone Age people were hunter gatherers. I can explain how tools and homes changed from the Stone Age to Iron Age. (Link to Y2 how building materials changed over time) I can explain that the Celts lived in tribes and describe what life was like in Celtic hill forts. 	 I can use/plot a timeline within a specific period of history. Migration: I can explain why the Romans, AS and Vikings invaded Britain and why they settled. I understand the Romans ruled over the largest and richest Empire in history. I can describe the changes made in Britain during Roman rule. (Link back to the Celts Y3). I can explain how the lives of wealthy people were different from the lives of poorer people in Roman Britain. I understand there are contrasting descriptions of Boudicca and explain that some evidence may be biased or unreliable. I can describe how the homes of Roman and Celtic people differed and make comparisons between the periods. I can explain how historic artefacts (Sutton Hoo) can be used to help build up a picture of life in the past. I can explain why Alfred the Great was seen as a Great King. I understand that the Battle of Hastings gave Britain a new King. 	 I can draw a timeline with different historical periods. I can use my mathematical knowledge to work out how long ago events happened. I can use research skills to find answers to specific historical questions. I can explain that Queen Victoria was the head of many countries and it was called the British Empire. (Empire link Y4) I can briefly summarise how 'The British Empire' had a major influence on the world. I can explain how the lives of wealthy people were different from the lives of poorer people in Victorian Britain. Migration: I can explain why Irish people migrated to Britain after the Potato famine in 1845. I can explain how the railways changed society and industry. I can explain some key features of Mayan civilization (writing, pyramids, temples) and compare and contrast them with Ancient Egypt'. (Y3). I can identify if a piece of evidence is Primary or Secondary. 	 I can place features of historical events and people from the past societies and periods in a chronological framework. I can research a period or event in history and present my findings to an audience. Migration: I can explain that during WW2 many soldiers & airmen from across the Commonwealth came to Britain to fight and their support was vital. (link to British Empire Y5). Local History Study - I can explain how WW2 affected Suffolk and the local area and how US soldiers were stationed here. I can explain how Jewish refugees came to Britain during this period. I can explain how WW2 impacted children. I can explain how WW2 impacted children. I can explain how people prepared for war. I understand that propaganda was used during the war and that historical sources may be biased. I can explain what life was like in Ancient Greece.
