

Y4 Home Learning Menu Autumn 1st Half Term 2025

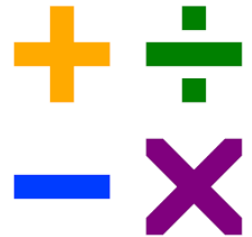
Topics: States of matter and The Roman Empire

*Means collect a sheet from the blue 'Homework Sheets' tray in the base

When selecting a piece of homework, if you do not understand the process or what is being asked (particularly with the maths), wait another week or two until you have been taught it in school.

Maths

- Autumn Place Value Code Breaker, follow the key to discover what number has been made and look at the digits values. *
- Autumn Walk game, follow the instructions on the sheet and add and subtract from the number given. You can always use column addition and subtraction methods to help you. *
- Agrippa's Roman Numeral Vases, follow the instructions and use your knowledge of Roman numerals to help. *
- Nero's sundial, complete the sundial numerals, you could even make the sundial yourself and see if it really works *



English

- Collect the Roman Coin reading comprehension sheets from the base. One sheet has all the information to read, the other has the questions. *
- Choose your favourite chocolate bar or sweet and describe everything about it, its shape, colour, smell, texture, taste and see if the class can guess what it is! You might like to put the answer under a flap so we don't cheat!
- Find a poem that you really like and practise reading it at home so you can perform it. Hopefully you can perform to a small group or the class without needing to read all the words.
- Write a book review of any book you have read at home. It can be a fiction or non-fiction book. If you would prefer to do this on a sheet to help you, collect one from the base.



Science and History

- Carry out a chocolate experiment. Place a small piece of chocolate in your hand and put your palms together. Count to 100 or say the alphabet 5 times keeping your hands together. When you have finished counting, open your hand and explain how the chocolate has changed. Try to use our 'States of matter' vocabulary like solid, liquid and gas if they are appropriate. You might like to take photos too.
- Research and describe the uses of The Colosseum both in Roman times and today.
- Write a fact sheet about the Roman Emperor Julius Caesar including at least 6 facts.
- Make a Roman artefact of your choice for our Year 4 museum, such as: a helmet, shield, coin or anything you can think of - be as creative as you like! *(This would be a good piece of homework to start with so our museum is not empty!)*



Complete one piece of homework each week. Over the half term, try to complete at least two from each subject list. Bring your homework to school by the end of each week.

As well as the Home Learning Menu above, you will be given spellings to learn each week, which you will be tested on Thursday. Mathematics homework will also be set on Friday's. Remember to keep learning your times tables (use Times Tables Rockstars) and read regularly at home too!
