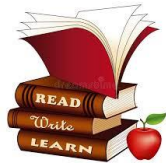
Topics: Ancient Egyptians, Light and Shadow, Forces and Magnets

**Means collect a sheet from your teacher*

Maths



- Make a simple game to help you to learn a times table you are stuck on. (Y2 times tables are x2, x5 and x10. In Y3, we move on to x3, x4 and x8)
- Look around you for examples of 2- and 3-digit numbers. Take photos or write the numbers down and partition them e.g. door number 267, write down 2 hundreds, 6 tens, 7 ones.
- Place value pirates.*
- Rocket Race game (a bit like 'Shut the Box') to practise adding.*
- Make a poster explaining how to do column addition or subtraction. (2nd half term)



English

- Ask for a reading comprehension task based on The Egyptians. Choose from: The Rosetta Stone, Friendly Felines, Cleopatra or Howard Carter. *
- Crack the Code - Egyptian hieroglyphics. *
- Ancient Egyptian Dictionary Matching Activity. *
- Write a book review of any book you have read at home. It can be a fiction or non-fiction book. If you would prefer to do this on a sheet to help you, ask your teacher.
- We will be learning about Tutankhamun this term. Choose a different pharaoh to research, and then produce an information sheet.

Other Subjects



- Make something Egyptian! For example, a sarcophagus, a pyramid, jewellery etc
- Design a Tutankhamun Death Mask.*
- Design and make a shadow puppet.
- Write a list of how many different sources of light you can find in your house and garden. Remember to use commas correctly!
- Research materials around your home using a magnet - can you make a list of items that are attracted to a magnet and a list of items that are repelled?

Homework



- Complete one piece of homework **each week**.
- Bring your homework to school on a **Thursday**.
- As well as the Home Learning Menu above, you will be given **spelling** homework each week. New spellings are given out every Monday, ready for a spelling test the following Monday.
- Remember to keep learning your **times tables**. Times Tables Rock Stars (TTRS) is an excellent way to prepare for the statutory times table check in Year 4. Login details should be stuck inside the cover of your reading log.
