This is your learning menu for the second half of the Autumn term. Please select 6 tasks to complete and hand in by Friday each week. The first piece is due in by Friday 5th November and the final piece should be handed in by Friday 10th December. Homework will be shared with the class and displayed in the classroom. We would like everyone to complete the 'Beat the Clock' maths task then you can choose 5 more that you think you would enjoy. In addition to the learning menu, the children will be given spellings every Monday. These will then be tested the following Monday. Please help your child to learn these and encourage them to spell them correctly in any work you do with them. It would also be helpful if you could continue to read with your child as often as possible and record this in their reading logs.

Then do the second 'Beat the Clock' sheet to see if your time has improved.	Complete a traffic survey to see what colour car is most popular. You could look out of your window or stand with a grown up at the end of your road and count the cars that go past in 5 minutes. You might even want to count cars on a daily walk to see which colour you see the most often. Once you have collected your data, we would like you to display it as a bar chart then write 4 things your chart tells you about car colours (Graph paper available on request).	Investigate items around your house and sort them into magnetic and not magnetic. Make a poster to show which objects were which.
