This is your learning menu for the second half of the Autumn term. Please select a task to hand in on Monday of each week. Homework will be shared with the class and displayed in the classroom. In addition to the learning menu, the children will be given spellings every Monday. These will then be tested the following Monday. Please help your child to learn these and encourage them to spell them correctly in any work you do with them. It would also be helpful if you could continue to read with your child as often as possible and record this in their reading logs.

Complete two tasks set on Mathletics.	Create a fact file or poster about the River Nile.	Explore friction on different surfaces. Take an object which can be pushed / pulled (e.g a marble). Investigate how different surfaces effect the speed of an object when pushed. Does it have high or low levels of friction and why is this? Could you make some predictions?
Create a Story Board using the website https://www.storyboardthat.com/storyboardtreator about whatever you would like. Our new narrative book is George's Marvellous Medicine by Roald Dahl. Can you make your own Marvellous Medicine? After you have created it, write a short descriptive paragraph about your medicine. Can you use expanded noun phrases, commas in a list and conjunctions (such as but and because) and subordination conjunctions (such as while, after and as)?	Practise counting in 2's, 5's and 10's. You could do this with songs, your toys or anything you can find. Be creative! Keep a diary about what you did over the weekend. Can you use adverbs of time (such as next, then, after and finally) and paragraphs?	Investigate items around your house and sort them into magnetic and not magnetic. Make a poster to show which objects were which. Make a Christmas decoration to hang on the tree.
