Welcome to Sebert Wood Primary School

We are committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of all children and recognise the contribution we must all make to protect children from harm. We expect all staff, visitors and volunteers to share this commitment.

This guide contains information about our expectations of you when visiting our school and gives information about our safeguarding and emergency procedures.

Keeping ourselves safe

- ALL visitors MUST sign in at reception on arrival (and sign out upon leaving).
- Visitors are issued with a badge and it must be worn at all times—we use the following lanyard system to identify everyone in school. BLACK = fully checked school staff, GREEN = non staff but full DBS and safeguarding induction, AMBER = external DBS checked, RED = accompanied at all times.
- Visitors are asked to read this guide in full on their first visit and sign the visitors log to say they have read and understood.
- Visitors remain in reception area until instructed by staff.
- Mobile phones are NOT to be used in the presence of pupils.
- Photographs are NOT to be taken without prior approval.
- Be a good role model to our pupils by being respectful, fair and considerate of others. Remember that children may interpret words/actions differently.
- · Report any unacceptable behaviour to staff.
- When working with pupils ensure you are visible to staff and DO NOT have physical contact with a child that could be misconstrued.
- Regular volunteers, agency staff, and outside club/coaching staff are required to provide evidence of enhanced DBS clearance for 'regulated' activities, and wear a visitors badge.

Key Safeguarding Information

- The key message for safeguarding is: 'if you see something, say something'
- The key elements of our policy are prevention, protection and support.
- If you have concerns about a child or a child discloses something to you speak to one of the trained Designated Safeguarding Leads (photos below) as soon as possible. They make a decision as to the next steps the school may need to take.
