Year 5 We've had another busy week in Year 5. As we were unable to go to Gressenhall for our trip on Tuesday, we had a Victorian day at school instead! The children enjoyed having their hands inspected by strict Victorian teachers. They learnt about the countries which were in the British Empire during the Victorian era, made a thaumotrope (a Victorian toy), learnt how Victorian children wrote in calligraphy script and watched some episodes of Hetty Feather, which was set in Victorian London. The children's costumes looked great, thank you!

Next week we will be writing a newspaper article based on happenings in the book Cogheart. We will be planning investigations linked to forces in Science.

In History we will be comparing Victorian schools to school life today. Our RE lesson will continue to explore the theme of happiness and in Art we will be learning how to use watercolours. We will focus on Anti-Bullving week in PHSE.

Year 4 Year 4 are really enjoying working on the story 'Mr Stink' and next week we will be looking at how Chloe is still trying to piece together Mr Stink's earlier life. The children will do some more work on using speech in their writing. In Maths, the children will apply their knowledge of subtracting larger numbers to solve word problems. In History, the children will be researching and writing about how the Roman army had to be very organised when invading Britain. We will then be discovering the instruments used to make music in Roman times. After an exciting Science lesson this week learning about the bones in the human body, we will be studying the different types of skeletons that insects and other animals have. The children will be learning and labelling household items in French; we wonder if they will be able to tell you any on Thursday evening?

Next Tuesday, the children will be having an additional PE session so they need to come to school on **both Tuesday and Wednesday in PE kits** please.

As part of the BBC Children in Need appeal, we have been looking at our emotional and physical wellbeing this week. The children enjoyed watching some videos led by Joe Wicks ahead of his PE challenge. We also looked at journaling as a way of exploring our thoughts and feelings. Year 2 On Monday the children learned all about the Great Fire of London. We looked at what the buildings were made of, what caused the fire and how it spread so quickly. Ask your child what they can tell you about it – you'll be impressed! On Wednesday we used our knowledge to make storyboards of the events. We have also learned about newspapers, including headlines, newspaper names and quotes. If you have a newspaper at home you could demonstrate these. We will be writing newspaper stories about the Great Fire next week. The children have also been watching Newsround, which is available on iPlayer. In Maths we will be learning about money, looking at coins and notes and using them to make different amounts.

Finally – if children wear earrings they should be studs, not hoops. Please make sure earrings are removed on Tuesdays for PE – this is for safety reasons. Thank you.
