Dear Parents/Carers,

This time last year I don't think any of us expected that we would still be living under restrictions and that yet another summer term would be disrupted by the Covid pandemic. We now know that the government are delaying the lifting of restrictions until 19th July, and so we shall have to continue with our current system of year group bubbles, hygiene and ventilation measures, social distancing and staggered drop off and pick-ups etc. Face coverings will continue to be worn around the school site and in school staff use them where social distancing is not possible and also take lateral flow tests twice a week.

SPORTS DAYS AND ACTIVITY TRAIL UPDATE:

Sadly the new variant and the subsequent delay to the lifting of restrictions has led to implications for some of the events and activities we had previously anticipated parents and carers could attend after 21st June.

Due to the continued restrictions on numbers outside we will now no longer be able to have parents attending events such as the Adventure Trail and Sports Days.

The limit of groups of 30 adults outside severely limits the logistics for organising a successful and enjoyable event. Everyone here is disappointed about this because we know how important it is for you to support your children at such events. We will of course share photographs of the events on our Twitter feed, which also appears on our website.

SUSPECTED CASES:

Please inform the school as soon as possible so we can take the necessary steps. It is now advised that all members of the household should be tested using a PCR test if there is a confirmed case. This is important because of the risk of asymptomatic cases.

By following the existing guidance and taking a cautious approach we hope this will limit the number of cases that may arise so that we do not have to shut down bubbles, resulting in children missing an important part of the school year, or families having to isolate during the summer holidays.
