They had lots of compelling arguments both in support of and against their question. In Class 13, the question was '*Should 10 year olds be allowed to vote*?' and in Class 14 the question was '*Should children be allowed to use their phones in school*?' Next week, we will begin to look at persuasive writing. In Maths, we have been consolidating our understanding of addition and subtraction of fractions. In History, the children completed their group research projects; they enjoyed filming their finished videos and presenting their Power point presentations to the class.

**Year 5** This week has seen the children plan a Scientific investigation based on forces. They are really looking forward to carrying them out next week!

In French we will be revising the vocabulary of school objects. Our History lesson will be examining the impact of railway building on Victorians. The children will be planning their own space games using 'Scratch' in computing. Having learnt to use watercolour paints this week, the children will be aiming to recreate one of JMW Turner's famous paintings. Anti-bullying will be the focus of our PHSE lesson and happiness will be the focus of RE.

**Year 4** Next week sees us completing the story 'Mr Stink' in class. The children have had some great opportunities for writing and have been brimming with ideas! In maths we will be moving on from addition and subtraction to multiplying in 10's and 100's. In History, the children will be looking at what advanced changes the Romans brought to Britain.

We are also busy trying to plan a 'Romans Day' where the children will be able to come to school dressed as a Roman or Celt if they wish. This will be held within the first 2 weeks of December so you might like to start thinking of costumes now. More details will follow shortly.

Our French lesson will cover basic prepositions of objects that the children know. Our music lessons for the next couple of weeks will be centred on learning Makaton for our chosen Christmas songs and practising singing them outside.

**Year 3** This week, the children really enjoyed the Science investigation where they sorted materials into those which were magnetic and those which were not. Class 7 have completed their Canopic jars and they look really great. Class 8 will complete theirs next week.

Next week in Geography, the children will look at the human and physical features of the Nile Delta. In Music, they will learn about rhythm and musical notation. In Science, they will carry out an investigation into magnet strength. In French, the children will learn how to say their age. In PSHE, the children have thought carefully about the different types of bullying and what to do if bullying occurs. Next week, they will discuss the reasons why bullying may occur.

Year 2 In our topic work this week we learned about what the houses looked like during the Great Fire and
how they differ from houses today. We made paper Tudor houses and made a model of London – the
children loved seeing how the fire spread! We then used this to draw a map of the fire, using a key to put
landmarks on.

In English we have been writing newspaper stories about the fire – the children are fast becoming experts! Next week we will be looking at reading comprehension, spelling and grammar.

In Maths we have learned how to count money in pounds and pence – we write this as "£10 and 50p". Next week we will explore making amounts in different ways, and how to give change.
