Year 6 We have been so impressed this week with how the children have approached their first ever Year 6 practice SATs. From these, we have been able to identify particular areas that need revision, especially in light of the short-lived Year 5 experience! Alongside completing these, the children have researched and written a non-chronological piece, around Ancient Greece, focussing on a topic of their choice. In RE, they also wrote a diary entry about their experience of the baptism of Jesus, or the Pentecost. It has been great to see the children's understanding of how to keep safe online; they have begun to produce a project for a particular target audience, to inform them about online safety.

The children all enjoyed listening to Mr Mason at Sybil Andrews yesterday during our Zoom assembly. They had the opportunity to ask lots of questions – hopefully they've told you all about what they found out!

This week the children have been given their passwords for Times Table Rockstars and Spelling Shed in order for these skills to be practised at home. At times, we will set specific tasks on these, however none in particular have been set this week. Please do still encourage your child to use these regularly.
