Year 6 Another busy week in Year 6: the children have made their periscopes today and had great fun testing them out. In English, both classes have been focussing on persuasive writing: Mr Crew's class have been writing persuasive adverts for the Ancient Greek Olympics, with Miss Woods's class continuing their work around their discussion 'Should 10 year olds have the right to vote?', by writing a persuasive letter. More work has been taking place around fractions in Maths, with a focus on multiplication and division. Again, it has been extremely encouraging to see how the children have been persevering during these lessons.

Next week, the children will be sitting another set of past SAT papers. We were incredibly impressed with how positively they approached this last half-term and it will be great to see how they have progressed after all their hard work since September.

The children have all been given lyrics for a Christmas surprise we are planning. Please encourage your child to learn these at home as we don't have many weeks left and only limited rehearsal slots, due to COVID restrictions!

On the topic of Christmas, in Year 6 we offer the children the opportunity to take part in our very own 'Secret Santa'. The maximum spend for those wishing to take part is £2.00. There are a few adjustments that will have to be made this year, but we are pleased to say that we are still able to carry this out. Your child will have brought home a permission slip today. Anyone who doesn't return their form in time will not be able to take part. We will attempt to recreate a famous Turner painting using watercolours in Art and in PHSE we will consider sources of support – very important at the moment!

Year 4 Can you believe we have made it into December already? Whilst we will be having some Christmas fun, we've still got lots of learning to do first! For the recording of our Christmas song, we would like all children to bring in a piece of Christmas headwear – either a hat or headband. Please make sure these are named and can be left in school for our rehearsals.

We are busy planning our Roman Day and sorting our costumes for Tuesday 8th December, and the children are looking forward to it. Our English lessons next week will start focussing on Boudicca whilst our Maths lessons will continue with multiplication. In Science, we are finding out about the digestive system. Over the next couple of weeks, the children will also be completing some standard spelling, grammar, reading and maths assessments based on what we have learnt this term.

Please note, we are still keeping our windows and doors open all day, to allow for maximum ventilation. As the weather has really turned much colder this week, some of the children have felt very cold in class. You may need to provide your child with an extra layer; vest, base layer or even a plain coloured fleece to wear over their jumper if needed.

Finally, your child has been given a login for 'Developing Experts', it is stuck into the back of their reading logs. This is a Science based site, which we may use in the event of a bubble closure alongside Google Classrooms. You do not need to do anything with it for now.

Year 3 The children have done an amazing job with their Canopic jars. They look really effective. This week, they really enjoyed the Geography work sorting the positive and negative facts about the Aswan Dam. Next week in Geography, the children will look at the uses of the River Nile and how they have changed over time. In Art, they will evaluate their Canopic jars. In Science, the children will design and make their own magnetic game. If they have already made one for home learning, the children may use this and develop it or make a different one. In PSHE, the children will discuss how bullying may occur when people do not respect one another's differences.

Year 2 In English this week we have been assessing children's skills in spelling, reading and grammar and have begun the phonics check which should have taken place at the end of Year 1. Next week we will look at Samuel Pepys' diary from the Great Fire and will have a go at writing our own version In Maths we continued to look at coins and notes, finding different ways to make the same amount. Next week we will be assessing skills in arithmetic and reasoning, and will begin to look at multiplication. In our topic this week we learned about Christopher Wren and how he redesigned St Paul's Cathedral. The children enjoyed sketching parts of the building and on Wednesday we used 2d shapes to make a collage of it.

We are setting a challenge for each class to earn an end-of-term treat. Class 6 are learning to work together as a team, and Class 5 are trying to increase the number of times they read to parents at home. Good luck with the challenge Year 2!

In Marvellous Maths we have been looking at the difference between 2D shapes (circle, triangle, square and rectangle) and 3D shapes (sphere, cylinder, cube and cuboid).
