#### EASTER HOLIDAY WORKS

You will be aware that part of the playground and field have been out of action for some time due to the ongoing drainage works. The delay to these works has been due to a major re-design of the drainage system. This means that a new larger manhole has to be installed and large parts of the existing drains replaced. This is a major job and requires a 2 week period, so has had to wait until the Easter holidays to allow enough time for completion. We have been assured that the playground will be back in full use immediately after Easter. Due to new grass seed, part of the field will remain out of bounds for a short while but we have been assured it will be ready for summer term clubs and sports events. In addition to works outside, some exciting developments are taking place to the atrium and library. The existing Blueberry Room is being moved and a new pupil work space is being formed in the current library area. The atrium is being carpeted throughout and existing and new library and seating/furnishings set up in the atrium. This will create a more open and flexible area which can be used as additional teaching space, a library area and central learning area at the heart of the main building.
