#### Early Years Update - 04.01.2019

#### Nursery

The children have their new homework menu. They have 5 pieces to choose from the list and have 6 weeks in order to complete them. We recommend that you spread the load and try to do one a week on average. Please make sure that work is presented nicely and *handwritten*.

#### Some changes to the timetable for your information:

Both classes will have gymnastics on a Monday morning. The children will also need outdoor PE kit on Wednesdays for tag-rugby. Trainers will naturally get very muddy and so a separate plastic bag within the PE kit for trainers is essential so that clothes don't get caked in mud! The children go out in most weather and so warm school kit is necessary. Please check the school website if you need reminding about kit requirements.

Both classes will need their recorders on a Wednesday afternoon starting in a couple of weeks. The first music session of the term next week will be music appreciation.

This week's maths homework is to get familiar with Mathletics. The children need to sign in with their user name and password which is in their reading logs. Please ask them to try some of the place value activities. The children should be confident with these areas of learning as we covered them in the Autumn Term. It's a great resource designed to consolidate what they have learnt in school.

### Year 6 Update - 04.01.2019

As we are sure you are aware, this term will largely focus on preparing the children for the SAT assessments they will sit in May this year. To help with this, the school have purchased revision guides for each child. Each week, we will set pages from these to be completed as homework. It is vital that the children complete these in a timely manner, as we will go through these during lesson time to address any misconceptions. Not only will they be used for homework, they may also be used during lessons; it is important that children have these in school each day.

We will set homework on a weekly basis, as follows:

Tuesday: Maths Thursday: Comprehension Friday: Spellings and Times tables Children will have a week to complete each piece of homework.

This week we have only set the following:

• Reading Comprehension- Fiction. Pg 2 – 11

The children have all been given their new logins for 'Times Tables Rockstars'. A link to the website can be found in the 'Learning Links' section of the school website. We would like each child to check their login works and begin to explore the program by trying out a few of the games on offer. We will begin setting specific weekly tasks from next week.

A few alterations have been made to the timetable, meaning that our P.E sessions now take place on Wednesday (Indoor) and Thursday (Outdoor). Please ensure your child has the correct kit in school for these sessions, and a bag for muddy trainers. A reminder that if your child cannot take part for whatever reason, please let us know in writing through either writing in your child's planner, Email to admin@sebertwood.co.uk or by writing a note.

Finally, an exciting week has been planned for the children in culmination for our World War 2 topic. This will take place week commencing 11<sup>th</sup> February. The children are able to dress up in period costume throughout the week to further enhance their experience.
