#### Year 3

This week we have set up our 'egg-speriment' and we are watching with interest to see what happens to the eggs which are soaking in different drinks. The children have really impressed us with their scientific thinking!

The children are learning lots of new skills through this project.

Our French lesson will focus on how adjectives change when feminine nouns are being described. This week in Geography we learnt about the different layers of the rainforest and which animals live in which part. Next week we will look at the effects of deforestation on animals, people and plants. In RE we will learn about the beginning of the Easter story.
