# **EYFS** Weekly update

#### Year 2

The children loved making their fruit kebabs this week – they had some really appetising designs! This helped consolidate their learning about healthy eating. In PSHE we have been thinking about risk, so it was also a good opportunity to think about how to prepare fruit safely.

We have also been learning about animal offspring. We talked about how baby animals change as they grow into adult animals. We then looked at different classes of animal – try asking your child if they can explain the difference between a reptile and an amphibian!

In English next week Mrs Alexander/Mrs Gilbert's group will be making leaflets to advertise the Year 2 Zoo. Mr Winch's group will focus on reading comprehension skills. Mr Winch's Maths group will look at measuring, whilst Mrs Alexander/Mrs Gilbert's group will work on problem solving.

As part of our PSHE sessions on risk children will be designing their own outdoor play areas, complete with safety features.

Many parents have asked how they can further support childrens' learning at home – the most useful things would be to hear them read regularly, to practice times tables (2, 5 and 10) and reminding them about capital letters/full stops when writing.
