Year 1

Welcome back! We hope you had a good break, the children wrote their holiday news on Tuesday and were very enthusiastic about all the exciting things they had done.

We have begun a new topic of dinosaurs and the children have enjoyed an 'Explorers' morning completing a variety of activities from looking for dinosaur bones in the sand to measuring out the size of a dinosaur on the playground. In maths we have had a reminder on forming our numbers correctly and next week we will begin our work on multiplication and will be continuing counting in 2's, 5's and 10's.

In Art our topic is sculpture, next week we will be sculpting with junk. If you have anything at home that we could use please send it into school with your child before next Wednesday. Thank you.

On a Tuesday and Friday we will be doing outdoor PE, please ensure your child has a named PE kit with trainers/plimsolls in school for the whole week. If your child wears tights please put a spare pair of socks in their PE kit. Long hair should be tied back on both days and earrings removed or covered, thank you for your support.

This Friday we have sent home the Year One homework for the first half of the summer term. This is all based around our dinosaur topic. We would suggest your child chooses one activity a week from the homework grid. We do not need to see homework each week but we will have a 'showing week' at the end of the half term when your child will be able to bring in a piece of homework they are proud of to share with the rest of the class. *More details to follow*.

As the weather is warming up, please provide a named sunhat and a coat in case of showers. Please apply sun cream before your child comes to school, there are now products available which will last the length of the school day. Thank you.

Year 2

Welcome back – the children have been full of exciting news about what they did in the holidays!

We have begun our 'Living Things' topic by focussing on Minibeasts. This week we have learned about minibeasts we might find in the back garden. We learned how venn diagrams work, and used these to classify minibeasts by looking at wings and how many legs they have. In the coming weeks we will look at microhabitats and go for a minibeast hunt!

This term our indoor PE session is on Mondays, and our outdoor PE is on Wednesdays.

You will be aware that during May, Year 2 undertake SATs in reading, maths and grammar/punctuation/spelling. We will be keeping these tests low-key so as not to cause any worries for the children. There is nothing parents need to do to prepare children for

these. The children sit tests throughout the year and these should feel no different. The results will feed into out teacher assessments, which will be given in school reports at the end of the year.

Year 3

Welcome back to the Summer Term! We hope that you had a restful and enjoyable Easter break.

Your child should have received a Home Learning Menu for the Summer Term. We look forward to seeing some more imaginative creations!

A polite reminder to return any outstanding swimming or Banham Zoo permission slips please. We still have several missing and without these cannot take your child off site, thank you.

Our first swimming session is on Tuesday, please ensure that your child has a full named swimming kit, including swimming hat, in an appropriate bag.

Our trip to Banham Zoo is on Thursday. Please ensure that your child is dressed in their school uniform, has a coat and remembers their packed lunch as well as a water bottle.

Next week we will be starting our RE unit of work about the Kingdom of God. We will begin by considering what a kingdom is and making a charter for a new kingdom. In French, we will be learning the vocabulary associated with families, starting with family names e.g. Mum, Dad etc. The children will practise shading techniques in Art and learn how to draw some animal body shapes. The sewing project started last term is just about complete and the felt rainforest animals look wonderful! Our Science lesson will focus on setting up an investigation to test the strength of different rocks.

One final reminder; we will go back to checking reading logs on a Monday during assembly time. Three reads at home during one week with an adult's signature earns one merit. To introduce an element of competition, we will count up which class has the most merits and that class will also earn two class merits!! Get reading!

Year 4

Welcome back! We hope that you have had a lovely Easter break! We have enjoyed listening to the children's stories of egg hunts and the fun they had in the lovely sunshine over the Easter weekend!

We have embarked upon the Summer Term with great enthusiasm this week with new topics such as: the Anglo Saxons, collage, dance and French numbers beyond 30.

Your child will need outdoor PE kit on a Tuesday this term and indoor PE kit on a Friday. Recorders will need to be in school on a Tuesday.

You have probably seen in the press and media that the government has introduced a multiplication check for all pupils in Year 4. All year we have been working towards the goal of learning all their times tables by the summer. Most children are on task to achieve this. If your child is struggling then please encourage them to keep practising on Mathletics and Times Tables Rock Stars.

The Multiplication Check will happen between 10^{th} and 28^{th} of June. There will be 25 questions from all the times tables up to 12 x 12. The children will be given 6 seconds to answer each question. We will continue to work on times tables in class every week as we have done since September. Like with reading, those children who succeed are those who practise and consolidate this learning in the peace and quiet of home.

Your child has taken home a new homework menu. Four pieces of completed work need to be handed in by half-term. Those who have not completed work from last term will complete it in school time. This is about teaching children to be independent learners and to be organised about their time. We also want them to enjoy their learning which is why they can choose from a variety of tasks to suit their strengths. It has been lovely sharing work in school that has been done at home and seeing work that has been collaborated upon by family members. For example egg carts which children worked on with grandfathers and cooking with parents or older siblings. We hope you have enjoyed some of the tasks too! All homework should be handwritten by your child as this is more important handwriting practise. To reach the expected standard in Year 4 children should have neat joined handwriting. Thank you for supporting your child with their homework menu.
