Reception

This week we have continued to think about the things we can recycle. In Maths we will be focussing on doubling, halving and learning the number bonds to 10 (all the different ways you add numbers together to make 10).

Sunshine Class will be going to the Woods on Monday to do some maths activities and Rainbow Class will go next week.

Next week our dinosaur theme will continue with a focus on dinosaur poetry where we will be thinking of descriptive words and rhymes. In maths we will be investigating weight and capacity and learning appropriate vocabulary such as full, empty, heavier than, lighter than, balanced.
