In English Mrs Alexander/Mrs Gilbert's groups have been looking at rhyming words using 'The Owl and the Pussycat'. Mr Winch's group have finished writing their 'Finding Nemo' stories and are now looking at spelling past tense words.

In Maths both groups continue to work on number, including place value, counting in steps and number bonds.
