

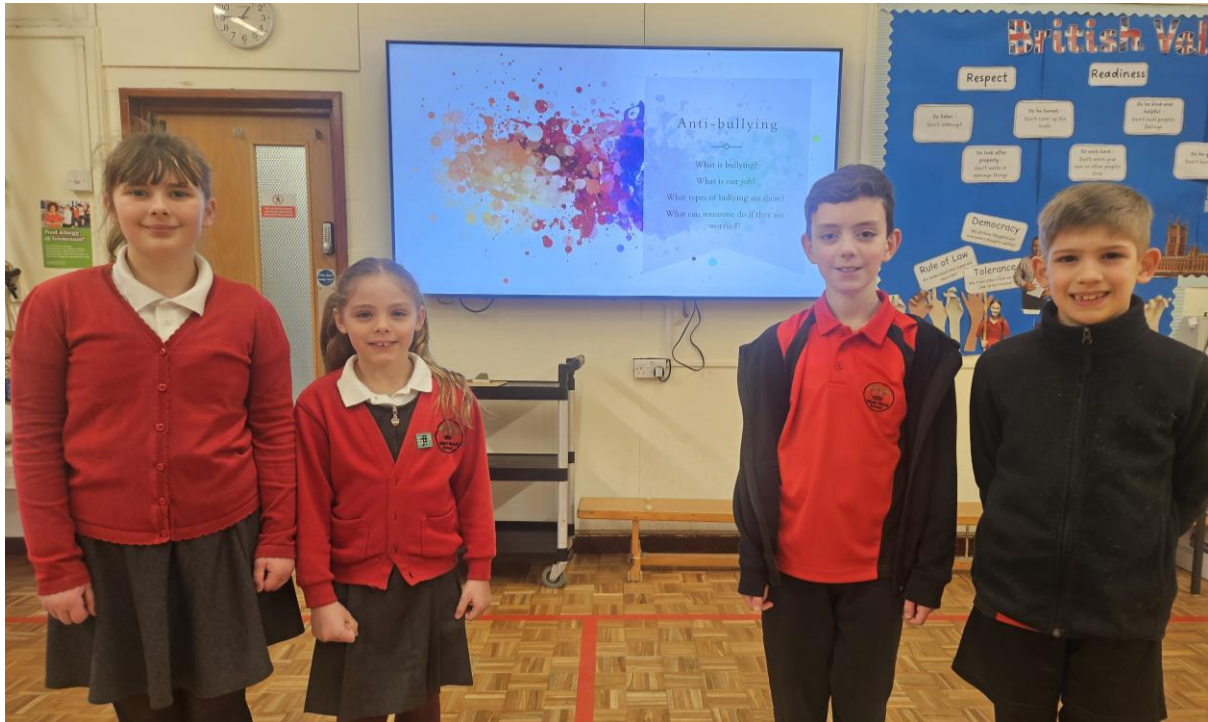

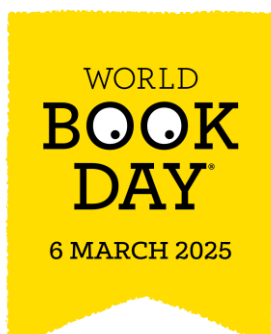
Anti-bullying



Four of our Anti-Bullying ambassadors led assemblies for Key Stage 2 this week. Cleo, Freya, Seb and Finley explained what the definition of bullying is, what types of bullying exist, and what children can do if they are worried about themselves or others in their class. They did a fantastic job of conveying their message and other pupils engaged well in discussions about why this help is important.

Children in Key Stage 1 looked at healthy friendships. We talked about ways of making friends, how friendships should make us feel, and how we should act if we want to be a friend to others.
