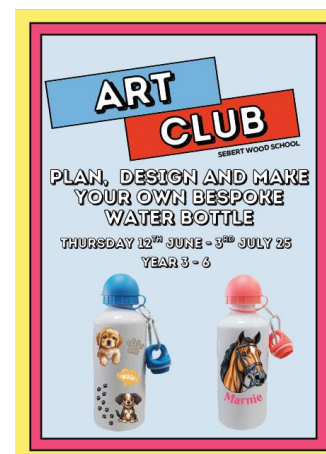
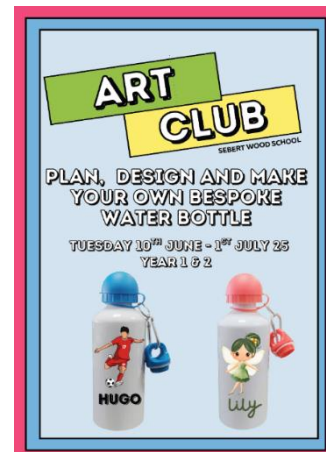
Dodgeball
