SEBERT WOOD PARENT SURVEY 2019—SUMMARY

Thank you to those of you who took part in the recent web based Parent Survey. We asked 23 questions covering a wide range of aspects of school life and also had sections for comments about areas you feel we do well, areas for improvement and any other comments. We received a total of 111 responses. We have analysed the results which you will find outlined below. We have combined those of you who 'strongly agreed' or 'agreed' to obtain the overall scores. Where significant, we have given a further breakdown of the scores and added some commentary. We have also included a selection of the comments made, although it isn't possible to include all of them here and many mention names, so we have excluded those for confidentiality reasons. We will of course be looking carefully at the results of the survey with staff, governors and School Council to see where we can improve the quality of our provision.

- 92% agree child/children are happy and enjoy school.
- 94% think school is welcoming and friendly.
- 92% agree school is a caring place.
- 84% happy with achievements and progress their child makes (13% disagreed and 3% didn't know or couldn't comment).
- 89% happy with standard of teaching (10% disagreed).
- 93% agreed their child feels safe at school.
- 70% happy with the information received when their child moves to a new year group or Key Stage. (17% of you disagreed and 13% didn't know or couldn't comment).
- 71% felt that there is someone their child can talk to about any worries they might have (15% of you disagreed and 14% of you didn't know or couldn't comment).
- 100% agreed that weekly updates, Parentmail, Twitter, newsletters and the school website are effective.
- 87% happy with the school learning environment, facilities and buildings (13% disagreed).
- 73% think the school has high expectations (17% disagreed and 12% didn't know or couldn't comment).
- 70% think the school prepares pupils well for the future (13% didn't know or couldn't comment, 17% disagreed).
- 89% of respondents feel comfortable approaching staff with questions, problems or concerns.
- 58% of you know who is on the governing body (30% disagreed and 13% didn't know or couldn't comment).
- 75% think the school works well with the community (14% disagreed and 12% couldn't comment).
- 73% agree there is a good range of extracurricular activities or clubs (23% disagreed).
- 74% think the school sets high standards of behaviour and discipline (24% disagreed).
- 93% agreed that the staff expect the children to work hard and do their best.
- 92% happy with the values and attitudes that the school teaches.
- 90% happy with the school curriculum and subjects taught (10% disagreed).
- 88% agreed that the school encourages children to be independent.
- 96% agreed that the school encourages active and healthy lifestyles.

An additional question this year was about the quality of additional support that your child may receive (medical, pastoral or learning support). 44% of you *agreed* that you are happy with the support received. 47% of you responded that you don't know about the support or don't feel able to comment. 8% of you *disagreed*. On reflection, this question may have been misleading for parents where their child is receiving normal classroom support or specific medical support. This is an area that may need further analysis and we are also reflecting on the way any support is communicated or explained.

SEBERT WOOD PARENT SURVEY 2019—SUMMARY, cont'd

Some examples of comments on the schools strengths......

Sebert Wood is a friendly, welcoming school with strong values and high expectations of behaviour. The children are taught to be well-mannered and the children are polite. This is particularly evident when Sebert Wood children are mixed with children from other schools.

Parents are kept in touch with weekly updates.

Staff are generally approachable and are supportive when children are having issues.

High quality teaching from a dedicated Teaching team throughout the school.

Being an inclusive, friendly, nurturing place for all children.

All staff work hard to provide a fun, stimulating learning environment and both of my children love Sebert Wood.

The school feels calm and organised which is reassuring. Office staff are very friendly, helpful whilst being very busy. Nothing is too much trouble and the children come first.

Sebert Wood is a very happy, friendly school which is perfect for the primary setting.

Senior leadership team are approachable with issues. They help and listen to the children and don't judge and know everyone is different.

Staff are amazingly supportive and friendly. Pastoral support is incredible. Thank you everyone and a massive well done.

Some examples of comments on how the school could be improved.....

Updating the curriculum and exploring new topics rather than relying on topics which have been taught year in year out. More drama lessons.

They should try to be more creative, providing more memorable and fun activities which will have more impact on their learning.

Teachers need to be moved around more frequently and encouraged to try new year groups. This would not only be good for their professional development, it would allow the children to experience different teachers to their siblings and encourage the curriculum to be updated with fresh ideas from new staff in that year group.

Having a better variety of clubs and lunch clubs. Some children need that support as the playground can be a lonely place. (there were a number of comments relating to having clubs other than sports clubs) Using outdoor spaces even in key stage 2 and getting away from learning always being classroom based. More Laptops, key stage 2 should not have to share and be over shadowed by more dominant children.

Some examples of additional comments......

The questionnaire should have more answer options, ie. In between Agree/Disagree, I didn't agree with everything I have put agree for but didn't feel strong enough about it to disagree. (this is something we will consider for the next survey)

Our child is in the last year at Sebert Wood and has had a very positive experience and thoroughly enjoyed the time here. There have been many great teachers and support staff who have inputted to the education and overall development and progress. My child says 'I will be very sad to leave Sebert Wood'.

As a new parent from a different school I am really impressed by Sebert Wood. The communication is heads and shoulders above other schools.

I feel there has been a high turnover of staff which has had an effect on my child's learning this year. I also feel some of the staff employed lack the experience and knowledge needed.

We feel privileged that our children have the opportunity to attend such a fine school and appreciate the dedication and hard work of all the staff.
