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CURRICULUM REVIEW

Following research by Ofsted into the effectiveness of curriculum design, a new inspection framework will be introduced in September 2019, which Ofsted have said will focus more on the curriculum and less on data! As a school we are currently reviewing our curriculum based on three main factors identified by Ofsted. Known as 'the 3 'i's' they are, Intent-what are we trying to achieve with our curriculum? Implementation-how do we deliver the curriculum, and Impact-what difference is the curriculum making to our pupils? These are great questions to ask and we are working with all staff and with the Governors Curriculum Committee to consider each of these questions and review our approaches to the curriculum. Ofsted have made it clear that they do not want schools to rush such a big undertaking and they understand this is a 'work in progress'. Based on this work, if we change any aspects of the curriculum we will update our website and share these developments with you.
