Year 5 Only one more week to go before we reach the half way point of Y5!

Next week we will be sorting healthy and unhealthy food in French. The dance that the children have been working on over the last few weeks will come together in the last lesson of the half term. We completed a lesson about ordnance survey map symbols in Geography, so we will be learning about the human geography of the UK next week. In Science the children will be carrying out an investigation which they have planned themselves about dissolving. They will then write a conclusion. The RE lesson will be based on rules. The children have been allocated their parts for the play we will be performing at the end of term. Scripts will be sent home—shortly. Please support your child learning their lines. We will also start working on the songs for our performance of 'Keymaster'. Further details will be sent out after half term regarding costumes. A polite request regarding children's mobile phones. Please can they be switched off at the gates when entering the school. This protects everyone's privacy and ensures that the children are not looking at inappropriate websites before school.

Year 4 In Geography, the children will contrast the Arctic and Antarctic regions. In Science, we will conclude the electricity unit with a short quiz. In PSHE, the children will continue to discuss what skills are needed to communicate well. In Art, the children will continue with their portraits in pencil of famous people. In Computing, the children will be planning a superhero live animation piece.

Year 3 Unfortunately, the Dental Nurse had to cancel her planned visit this week, and is also unable to attend next week. We do hope to rearrange and will let you know the new dates as soon as possible. Therefore, there is no longer any need to send in toothbrushes on Monday 10th Feb. Instead, the children will be learning about the importance of a healthy and balanced diet. We no longer have a tennis coach for our Wednesday PE session, but the children will continue to build on the tennis skills learnt so far. In Philosophy, we are discussing worries and what strategies we might be able to use. As part of this, we will be looking at mindfulness; spending some time on positive thoughts, breathing exercises etc. In Art, we will be walking the children to the Abbey Gardens next Friday morning to carry out a 'river survey' of the River Lark so please ensure your child has suitable walking shoes and a warm coat, thank you!

Year 2 This week the children consolidated their learning about Greenland by comparing life there with life in Bury St Edmunds. We were impressed with what they'd remembered! Next week we will use picture books to think about the dangers of climate change, and what we can do to help the world. In English this week both groups will write their own versions of fairytales, building on aspects of grammar they have learned this term.

In Maths Mrs Alexander & Mrs Gilbert's group will look at multiplication and division word problems. Mr Winch will look at ways of recording data using tally charts, pictograms and graphs.

Year 1 Next week our final traditional tale will be 'The Three Little Pigs'. In maths we have begun our work on measuring, this week thinking about length and measuring using standard and non standard measures. Next week we will be continuing learning about how we measure the length of something accurately.

Class 4 will be having their 'Marble Jar Treat' on Wednesday! They have chosen to bring in a teddy. Please ensure that it is small enough to fit in their tray, thank you.

Reception The children have been learning about Chinese New Year customs and celebrations and in PE and we all had a fantastic time performing a dragon dance!

Next week we will be looking at coins in Marvellous Maths comparing sizes and colours.

On Safer Internet day next week we will be talking about 'how to stay safe when using the internet' and we will be reading a book called 'Clicking Chicken' during storytime.

Nursery The children have really enjoyed all of the activities about the Gruffallo's Child this week. We have re-told the story, done some drama and made our own gruffallo hand puppets and hats! Next week we will be doing lots of Valentine's day activities.
