**Year 6** It's been another busy week in Year 6. In English, we have been writing formal persuasive letters inspired by our novel, 'Letters from the Lighthouse' and, in Maths, we have been consolidating our understanding of equivalent fractions before moving on to addition and subtraction using these. In Computing, we have begun to learn about writing in code – the children particularly enjoyed having a go at semaphore this week - and in History, the children have been researching in depth about some of the leaders during WW2, in readiness for writing a biography. For the 'mend and make do' WW2 art topic, we would appreciate any donations of pieces of fabric, pillow cases/approx. A3 size) as the children will be making purses, thank you!

**Year 5** Another hard working week in Y5. The children are enjoying finding out about the fascinating country of Russia and linking Art and English in to this too. If you have any Russian nesting dolls, we would be grateful to borrow them for our Art project, NAMED please, thank you. Our Maths focus is multiplication. Please support your child reinforcing or learning their times tables at home, as some children are still unsure of these facts, making it difficult for them to complete word problems or multiplication calculations involving bigger numbers.

Next week we will be learning the French vocabulary associated with making sandwiches. Indoor PE will continue with dance and outdoor PE with Tag Rugby. In Geography we will study the physical geography of the UK and in science we will be testing the properties of different materials. The children will be exploring how to show emotion on the faces of Russian nesting dolls they are designing and in RE we will be discussing the Humanist creed.

**Year 4** The children have submitted some well-presented and thoroughly-researched pieces of home learning this week. Some of these will go on display in the classrooms.

Next week, the children will draw and make more complex circuits in Science. In Geography, they will learn about the lives of the Inuit people. This week in PSHE, the children have discussed what they are good at doing and, next week, they will identify skills they would like to develop. In French, the children will learn about festivals. In Art, the children will explore and recreate Warhol's 'Campbell's Soup' artwork.

Year 3 Next week in Science, we will be looking at the different types of teeth and their specific functions. Thank you to those who have sent back their permission form for the Dental Nurse visit on February 10<sup>th</sup>. We understand some children may be unsure whether they wish to participate in the activity. We have explained that they can decide during the session, but that they will not be able to join in unless they have a signed permission form. If you need another copy of the letter, please ask one of the Year 3 team. In Computing, the children are moving onto using the iMovie app to create some short films. They will spend some time next week exploring trailers before they begin to plan their own presentation. During the next two weeks in French, we will be learning the names of body parts; learning to sing 'Heads, shoulders, knees and toes' in French. In Music, we continue to learn how to play simple songs on the glockenspiel, whilst in Geography the children will learn about the stages of a river. Do please send in any food magazines you no longer need so that we can start our Art project soon – we have only had a few sent in so far!

**Year 2** The children had a great time at their first swimming session and were very well behaved – well done Year 2! This week we looked at physical geographic features of Greenland such as glaciers, mountains and sea ice – try asking your children what they can remember!

We have begun a new unit of RE, looking at Islam and things that Muslims believe. In Science we are investigating what causes ice to melt, and in Computing we are learning to create pictures using Paint programme software.

**Year 1** Next week we will be working on the story of Jack and the Beanstalk. We will be continuing our work on subtraction. Please ensure that your child has a P.E. kit in school, thank you.

We would be very grateful if keyrings could be removed from any reading bags as they can make it difficult for the children to access their reading books.
