As we approach half term we have been considering the best ways to update parents on how their child has settled into school given the current situation. Thank you once again for your ongoing understanding and cooperation during the current situation. Although levels of COVID nationally are rising, here in West Suffolk we are fortunate that the rates are still very low. However, we are constantly reviewing our systems here in school, following government guidance and watching the local situation closely. Enabling 400 plus pupils to get into school is a huge logistical task and we rely on parents to follow **social distancing**. A reminder that current government guidance does not require parents to wear masks outside when on the school premises. However, it is entirely up to you if you wish to wear a mask. Some staff will be wearing masks and/or visors when they are greeting pupils at the classroom doors.

INDIVIDUAL SCHOOL PHOTOGRAPHS will be taken this WEDNESDAY 7th October (within COVID guidelines). Please note these are individual photos only as no sibling pairs/group photos can be taken at this time.

Given the current situation and the works on site it is important that you do not arrive on site too early for your drop off time and please be cautious and supervise your child/children closely.

Year 6

This week we have focussed around the more complex grammatical elements of the curriculum; in particular, we have looked at compound and complex sentences, as well as active and passive voice. The songs and raps we used to help us learn about these topics are extremely catchy – why not ask your child to share them with you!

Maths has been a recap on addition and subtraction, consolidating our understanding of the formal written methods for these. Next week, we will begin to look at formal methods of multiplication. To support this, please continue to encourage your child to access 'Times table Rockstars' at home – we will be looking on Monday to see who has been practising over the weekend!

In preparation for our learning next week about 'The battle of Marathon', the children learnt about the Ancient Greek city states, in particular Athens and Sparta and the difference between them.

Year 5 We have had another great week in Y5. The highlight this week was the Science lesson using Jaffa Cakes to learn about the phases of the moon! See what your child can remember.

Next week we will be beginning a unit of work in Maths on statistics. Maybe you and your child could look for examples of tables, graphs and charts in newspapers and magazines. We will focus on diary writing in English. In Science, we will be asking the children to plan an investigation, focusing on the vocabulary and organisation needed for this. Our History lesson will examine the work of Lord Shaftesbury and Dr Barnado in improving the plight of poor Victorian children. In French the vocabulary taught will be about what characteristics people have and don't have. The theme of online friends will be explored in Computing and we will continue to learn about Hindu mandirs in RE. Our philosophy discussion will be based on whether animals should be used in space trials or not.

Football skills will continue to be taught in PE. As the weather has changed, can we politely remind you to provide your child with a change of shoes for outdoor PE and a carrier bag to put the muddy ones in? Appropriate outdoor clothing will also be needed. Thank you.

Year 4 Firstly, apologies for the very short update last week; for some reason the entirety of the document didn't save correctly, so you only received the initial paragraph! Oops!

All children have now been given new login details for Spelling Shed, Times Table Rock Stars and Mathletics. You will find them all in the front of their reading logs.

Next week will be looking at how heating and cooling affect the states of matter in Science. Our Geography lesson will continue to focus on volcanoes in Italy. As we are trying to avoid singing in school, this week in Music, we started to learn a song using a basic version of sign language known as Makaton. The children all did really well remembering the different signs and we are aiming to finish learning the rest of the song next week. In Maths, we have been re-capping on our knowledge of place value from Year 3 and focussing on building this further to incorporate problems involving thousands. Our English lessons are going to focus on the author David Walliams.

Please note that as the weather is deteriorating, the children's PE lesson on the field will begin to result in lots of muddy footwear. Please ensure your child has a spare pair of trainers or shoes, plus socks to change into after PE to prevent the classrooms from getting mucky!

At times, members of Y4 staff may need to be outside before the official start of the school day. Whilst it may be tempting to ask them a quick question or pass a message on, please wait until a member of staff opens the Year 4 entrance door at 8:50. Thank you.
