**Year 2** In English this week we have been thinking about diaries. We looked at Samuel Pepys' diary and are now trying to write our own versions! We are trying to use conjunctions (and, because, so, but, then) to make our sentences more exciting.

In Maths we are looking at the early stages of multiplication. We start with repeated addition (ie 5 + 5 + 5 + 5) then link this to 4 lots of 5 or 4x5. The children have also been drawing arrays to demonstrate multiplication – if you've never heard of this before, ask your child to demonstrate!

We are now moving away from the Great Fire and focussing on Science. We are learning about the properties of materials like wood, glass, plastic and metal.

A final request – in the New Year we need lots of *long cardboard tubes like the ones in rolls of wrapping paper*. Please don't get rid of any you have – please send them in and we'll put them in quarantine! Have a great weekend
